

# Year 1 Term 1A Overview

Objectives that are in **pink** are a Y1 statutory requirement and individual words highlighted pink are from the Y1 non-statutory example words and their exceptions. The additional words and sets (in black) either reinforce the rule/ pattern being taught; revise previously visited spelling rules from lower year groups; practise a spelling rule linked to a Y1 statutory requirement or practise the common exception words (with an asterisk). Each set of spellings contains 10 words linked to the objective. Please note that all of the common exception words are not covered in these lists.

Dear Parents,

This is your child's spelling overview for the first half term of the autumn term. Each half term we will be sending out these overviews so that you can be practicing with your child at home.

Each week your child will come home with a spelling list. They will have been challenged to also find **5 other words which fit the rule.** As homework, your child will need to prove they can use each word in context by using each word in a sentence.

Your child will be tested using a variety of methods. These will ensure that they not only know how to spell the word but can also use it in their writing. This means that on some occasions, your child will not have a score out of 10.

At the end of each unit there will be a dictation test to assess how well they have learned the words over the half term.
