Forest		A large area of land covered with many trees and other plants.
Oak trees		A tough, lasting wood that comes from a tree
Beech tree		A tree that has smooth, grey bark.
Evergreen		having green leaves that stay on a plant throughout the year.
Deciduous		having leaves that drop off each year.
Rain forest		a dense evergreen forest, mostly found in tropical areas, that receives a large amount of rain all year long.
Deforestation		the act or process of cutting down the trees of a forest.
