GKCS Science Fair








Thank you to the parents who completed the survey at the end of parents' evening last half term. In total, we received 113 responses.


Below is a summary of the information shared by parents. Congratulations to Year 5 parents for having the highest number of returns!




The feedback on attendance at parents' evenings confirms our view that there should be both options available for parents, and that we will continue to offer attendance both in person and virtually.


I have included the free text responses at the bottom and I responded to some of the points raised.


Once again, thank you for your feedback. This year we have decided that we are going to gather feedback through a range of shorter, more targeted surveys, as we believe it will provide us with more meaningful responses. To support this, 113 responses is higher than any parent survey we have sent out in the past two years, where the average response rate has been around 80 responses.





























Any other feedback you would like to share about your parents evening experience:

parents will be using, the most secure way of sharing the link is via Class Dojo. If you have a specific concern about

the link, we recommend that you contact your child's class teacher before parents evening so that they can ensure that

the meeting code is shared with you.

Mrs Fabre is fabulous

Never enough time for us to ask more questions or discuss things in more detail. Think teacher

needs space between appointments. Our response: whilst we appreciate that there are time constraints, we believe that 10 minutes is enough time to ensure that there are enough appointments for all parents. The evening is scheduled over three

hours with many teachers seeing parents outside of these times for parents who are unable to attend. All teachers

are scheduled a break during the evening and we do ask that parents stick to time. We do not wish to move to a

system such as 'School Cloud', as this would automatically cut parents off after the allocated time. We do

recognise that sometimes it feels like you need longer, however, if after parents' evening you feel there are still

items that need to be discussed, the class teachers will happily arrange a follow-up with you.

Overall formal, box ticking approach to parents as well as students lacking individual and personalised approach. Typical of old school standards and practices. *Our response:* parents' evening is a

formal event and an opportunity for class teachers to update parents on the attainment and progress of their child.

They will also attempt to cover any targets or things that can be done to further support your child. As your child

progresses through the school, it is important that the core attainment information is shared, and the older the

children get, the more specific assessment information is shared. The autumn term parents evening, has a

greater pastoral focus and the spring term parents' evening focuses mainly on attainment and progress. This is to ensure that parents are aware of how well their child is doing, rather than leaving it to the end of year report. Everyone

recognises that the time frame is set, and class teachers are often conscious that they want to get over as much information as possible.

The teachers are great and the experience was very positive.

Unfortunately I feel I must mention parking on Cryers Hill Lane and the impact with later afternoon traffic was not

difficult particularly for parents who were picking up from clubs. Maybe in future clubs should be called off to

ease traffic/parking at this busier time of day. *Our response: whilst we appreciate that parking is a challenge, the*

continuation of after school club provision during parents' evening is important to ensure that parents who

require childcare can access it. Many parents choose to attend parents' evening whilst their child was at a

club, as this meant that they did not need to find alternative childcare arrangements.

We needed more time to go through other concerns we have. We had 10 minutes online which was not enough time for us to ask any questions.

The time should be longer as your child moves up year groups - 5 minutes is long enough for our daughter in reception, 10 minutes isn't long enough for year 3 - 15 would be better. *Our response: the average*

time allocated nationally for a parents' evening appointment is five minutes; we do not feel that five minutes is long

enough and have stuck to the 10-minute allocation. For a class of 30 children, this means that the class teacher

will have 2 hours and 30 minutes of booked appointments and talking across two evenings. To increase this time by

five minutes would increase the booked appointment times by 2.5 hours, and this would not be manageable or

reasonable. The vast majority of teachers and parents find that within the 10 minutes, the conversation naturally

draws to a close. The class teachers use Class Dojo and other communication methods to ensure that parents evening

information does not come as a surprise. All parents have the option to contact their child's teacher on Class Dojo, and

many do so to ask specific questions.

If we had the chance to look at work we would come into school for these meetings. *Our response: each term, we*

hold open classrooms for parents to look at their child's work and see the classroom. We moved this outside of

parents' evening at the request of parents, as they wanted longer to look at their child's work. Open classroom

dates are always shared in the newsletter and are well attended.

There was distraction from the other year group teacher talking but fully understand that space is

difficult. Our response: we have tried many arrangements for parents' evening, including using the hall. Staff often

choose to hold parents' evening appointments in one classroom; this is for the safety of all attendees.

Understand my child.

Very pleased with communication from reception teachers, great 2 way conversation. Also appreciate the option to attend remotely.

Very well organised and efficient.

Would be helpful for parents to have the opportunity to feedback about the school, there isn't an opportunity to readily do this. School should be a community that has opportunity for staff, parents and children to give feedback. Our response: this was an opportunity for parents to provide feedback; we have decided to break down the opportunities for feedback rather than just sending an annual survey – the response rate to this survey was significantly higher that last year's parent survey. Staff are also provided with a range of opportunities to provide feedback. There is a significant amount of work conducted on

pupil voice – Miss Forbes leads on the work with the school council, and the senior leadership team hold learning reviews

monthly with pupils to gain their views. The head boy and girl also provide feedback.

You're all doing an amazing job. Our lot skip into school every morning.




Pre-loved uniform


What is Holi?

Also known as the Festival of Colours, the Festival of Spring, and the Festival of Love, $\underline{\text{Holi}}$ is primarily a $\underline{\text{Hindu}}$ festival, celebrated by followers of the Hindu religion. It is now a worldwide celebration and is mostly acknowledged in countries in Asia, such as India, Nepal, and Bangladesh, but everyone is encouraged to take part and enjoy the celebrations.

What is the significance of Holi?

The Holi festival has many meanings attached to it.

- 1. It signifies the end of winter and the beginning of spring.
- The blossoming of love, a celebration of friends and family and the chance to make amends and repair broken relationships.








Though primarily a festival of fun and celebration, there are several traditions related to Holi:

- The lighting of the Holika (Hindu goddess bonfire).
- Gulal colourful powder thrown around.
- Sweets many foods and sweets are eaten during Holi.
- Rangoli though not a Holi-specific tradition, many people will create rangoli patterns in front of their homes to welcome the goddess Lakshmi and bless its residents with wealth and good fortune.
