PE and Sport Premium Funding

The PE and Sport Premium is additional government funding provided to schools to improve the quality of physical education, physical activity and sport for all pupils.

Funding Received

How the Funding Was Used

The funding was used to enhance PE provision, increase participation in sport and physical activity, improve staff expertise and provide opportunities for all pupils to engage in competitive and extracurricular activities.

Impact of the Funding

During 2025–2026, the PE and Sport Premium funding enabled the school to:

- Enhance the quality of PE teaching through staff professional development.
- Provide pupils with a wider range of extracurricular sporting opportunities.
- Increase participation in inter-school competitions and School Games events.
- Maintain high-quality PE equipment and resources.
- Broaden opportunities for pupils to develop teamwork, resilience and sporting skills.
- Ensure pupils have access to a variety of sporting experiences beyond the national curriculum.

Inclusion and Equal Access

Great Kingshill CE Combined School is committed to ensuring that all pupils can benefit from PE, sport and physical activity opportunities.

Targeted funding was used to improve opportunities and participation for:

- Pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND)
- Pupils with long-term medical conditions
- Disadvantaged pupils
- Girls' participation in PE, sport and extracurricular physical activity

This supports the school's commitment to inclusive practice and equal access for all learners.

Swimming and Water Safety

The government requires schools to report on Year 6 swimming attainment.

Year 6 Swimming Outcomes (2025–2026)
